Survey of Likely General Election Voters Erie & Northampton Counties, Pennsylvania

September 30 – October 1, 2024 | n=420 | ±4.77%

- In a **reversal from 2020**, Pennsylvania's "Bellwether Counties" have narrowly **swung back to Donald Trump**. Erie and Northampton Counties, which voted for Barack Obama twice, Donald
 Trump in 2016, and Joe Biden in 2020, favor Donald Trump by a point (49 48) with **less than five weeks** until Election Day and voting already underway.
- Other key factors, including a higher job approval, greater trust on the issues, and a more favorable image demonstrate Trump has more upside to grow his lead.
- By a 49 46 margin, voters in these counties **believe Trump's policies are better** for people like them, and by an 11-point margin voters **approve of Donald Trump's job performance** while he was in the Oval Office (50% approve) over that of the Biden-Harris Administration (39% approve).
- Recent buyer's remorse expressed Democrats over not picking Governor Josh Shapiro as her running mate are validated by the fact that a Harris-Shapiro ticket would be ahead +1 in these predictive counties (48 47). This is driven by a 10-point net shift in Harris' favor among swing voters under a Harris-Shapiro vs Trump-Vance matchup. With all eyes on Pennsylvania, this decision by Harris could very well cost her the presidency.
- Harris's image (-8 unfavorable) is more underwater than Trump's (-4 unfavorable). This is most apparent among men under the age of 55 (Trump +24 net fav / Harris -36 net unfav) but Trump is also viewed more favorably than Harris with non-college women, older women, and college-educated men.

- Even more **alarming for Democrats** and this is consistent with the state's voter registration trends is that Bellwether voters' perception of the Democratic Party is now -13 net negative, compared with the GOP at just a -4 net negative rating.
- As Democrats have a 4-point party registration advantage in these counties this is further
 evidence of these ancestral Democrats increasingly leaving the party of their forefathers.
- Shapiro has a much more favorable image (+14 favorable) than Harris's running mate Tim Walz (+2 favorable). Comparatively, Walz's image is much worse with older and college-educated men in addition to union households. These are the same groups Walz drags Harris down with on the ballot compared to a hypothetical Harris-Shapiro ticket.
- Much like the rest of the country, voters in Erie and Northampton are sour (2:1) on the direction of the country under the Biden-Harris Administration (30% right direction, 64% wrong track).
- **Key to Pennsylvania's shift to the right** (after Democrats won the state in every Presidential Election from 1988 to 2016) is Trump's cementing the GOP as the **Party of the Working Class**. Never more evident is this than in the Bellwether Counties where Trump leads +16 with **union households** (57 41) In addition, **Trump leads +13** with those making **under \$100k** a year (60% of voters in these counties), while **Kamala leads +18** with those making **six-figures plus**.



- You see the same inversion along lines of educational attainment. **Non-college voters** the former base of the Democratic Party are Trump +20. **College-educated voters** the former base of the Republican Party are Harris +27. This is wildly huge **47-point education gap**.
- Other fault lines in these most historically-predictive counties:
 - Women <55: Harris +25 // Men <55: Trump +29
 - Married men: Trump +18 // Unmarried men: Trump +17
 - Married Women: Trump +5 // Unmarried women: Harris +30
- Trump earns the support of 84% of White Evangelicals, 57% of Catholics, 50% of Mainline Protestants, and also leads with Unaffiliateds (53 – 40) and swing voters.
- Though a small group, Trump is winning voters who have not participated in the last four elections (10%) – read: new voters or those who haven't voted in a very long time – by a 2:1 margin.
- Two-in-ten Bellwether voters believe Harris is a moderate, and she wins 95% of them. This
 underscores the need of the Trump campaign to triple-down on defining Harris as the far-left,
 radical San Francisco Liberal she is. 50% of voters currently say Harris's political ideology
 and beliefs are very liberal and Trump wins 87% of these voters.




- When asked, most swing voters (those Probably Trump, Probably Harris, Or Undecided on the Presidential ballot) told us verbatim there's not much of anything either candidate could do at this point to earn their vote or flip their soft support. Securing the border in a second term was cited for those signaling an openness to Trump, while moderating her positions and utilizing the power she has to fix our nation's problems NOW could help Kamala.
 - "If she [Harris] was a moderate candidate and not a wolf in sheep's clothing."
 - "Not flip flop on issues and address problems now as sitting VP."
- Things look slightly better for the Democrats at the congressional level as the generic congressional ballot is tied at 47%, and Senator Bob Casey barely leads Republican Dave McCormick by three in the race for U.S. Senate (47 44).
 - McCormick runs 7-points behind Trump with married women and women without a degree.
- **Inflation and the economy** (31%), illegal immigration and border security (23%), and threats to democracy (14%) are the **top issues** on voters' minds in these counties.
 - Swing voters over-index on economic concerns (57%) and illegal immigration (26%) issues Republicans hold trust on and should benefit Trump.
- Harris is vulnerable on the issue of fracking. Half of voters expressed support for fracking in Pennsylvania (only 21% oppose) and less than one-third believe Kamala's newfound support for it is real.

- Aside from abortion, Bellwether voters trust Trump to handle most of the main issues that will decide this election.
 - **Economy and jobs**: Trump +6 (52 46)
 - Cost of living and inflation: Trump +7 (52 45)
 - Illegal immigration and border security: Trump +15 (56 41)
 - **Crime**: Trump +6 (52 46)
 - Abortion: Harris +14 (39 53)
- Despite Kamala's lead on abortion, only 18% of Bellwether voters share her position that it should be legal until birth.
- When asked in their own words why their county has swung back and forth between Obama,
 Trump, and then Biden, a familiar story was told that seems to thread the largely industrial,
 working-class, formerly "big blue wall" states together:
 - "Lots of working-class white people who felt left behind in the Obama era but weren't as excited about Trump after his first term."
 - "This county has a high percentage of working-class people. They want both
 conservative values, a strong economy and military and gun rights, but also NEED
 candidates who help the poor/working class and care about the environment without
 limiting job opportunities..."

- Machine-learning generated four segmentation analysis groups: Dem Base (48%), GOP Base (43%), Lean GOP (5%), and Moderate Female Catholics (4%).
 - <u>Lean GOP</u> (5%) are slightly more educated and suburban than GOP Base. They are strongly Republican on the generic ballot and even stronger for Trump on the presidential ballot. They're not as ideological as the GOP Base. Inflation and illegal immigration are their two biggest issues, and a large number support fracking. They skew male, older, and are the least religious segment. Lean GOP voters are also the lowest propensity to show up and vote.
 - <u>Moderate Female Catholics</u> (4%) are pessimistic and don't like Trump personally or Harris but lean Trump on the presidential ballot; most approve of his job performance as president. They're split on the generic ballot and U.S. Senate races, however, with most undecided. Their hard support for Trump would have been cut in half had Harris picked Shapiro. Despite being Catholic, they're more liberal on abortion and trust Harris by a plurality on the issue over Trump. They are the most likely segment to live in a union household, are the highest propensity to vote, and are not college educated.









Generic Ballot








Percent Change: Generic Ballot to Harris v Trump







